Pelican also leads vital clinical research aimed at extending and improving the lives of TODAY'S patients.



PELICAN POINTERS PLANNING



GETTING STARTED. QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF?



HOW MUCH TIME CAN YOU SPARE? Some ideas take much longer than others to prepare, set up and hold.



CAN YOU MAKE THE TIME? If it is an active event, do you have time to train?



HOW DO YOU START TO PLAN? If you are a good planner, then you will be able to do this easily. If not, what about asking a family member or friend to help?



THINK ABOUT THE FOUR MOST IMPORTANT ELEMENTS:

WHAT? What are you going to do? What event can you hold?

WHEN? When do you want to/are you able to hold it?

WHERE? Do you need to book a venue/request permission?

WHO? Do you need helpers, will it involve other people to get involved in the challenge, or do you need to invite guests or tell people?



KEEP LISTS OF THINGS! No need to panic if you keep a list of things you need for your event, whether it be training gear, drinks, decorations or a float you will be organised and ready to go on the day.



MOTIVATION! Why not set yourself a fundraising target once you have planned your event? This can be very motivating for yourself and also for your sponsors and supporters!



WILL IT COST MONEY TO PREPARE? Some ideas may require registration fees, preparation costs or deposits, so think about this when you are planning. Keep good records of these costs in case you need to take them out of the money you raise later.



PELICAN POINTERS - MONEY

HANDLING MONEY—It's a good idea to plan this, as it would be a great shame to loose any of your hard earned money!



In advance of the event, record any donations that you may be given, and keep hold of all receipts and invoices.



On the day think about whether you need a cash box or ice cream tub to keep your money safe and make sure anyone helping you knows what to do.



After the event, please DO NOT SEND US CASH IN THE POST, a cheque is easier and safer for us to process—please make cheques payable to **Pelican Cancer Foundation**.



If you are an employee of a company, ask if they operate a 'Matched Funding' programme—many larger companies will match the money that their employees have raised with a company donation. It is always worth asking!



PELICAN POINTERS - RAFFLES AND LOTTERIES

RAFFLES AND LOTTERIES

Lotteries are games where people buy a chance to win a prize. Raffles are a form of lottery, and are widely used by fundraising organisations of all sizes, whether organised internally or by volunteers. The legislation surrounding lotteries can be far-reaching and it is important to be confident that you fully understand and comply with the regulations.

If you can you answer 'Yes' to all of the following questions, you do not need to worry about a licence:



Is the raffle/lottery part of your event only?



Will you only be selling tickets during the event, and on the event premises?



Are you selling all the tickets at the same price?



Will the draw take place during the event?



Is there no rollover?



If you are unsure about the law surrounding raffles and lotteries, please get in touch with your local authority as they can offer practical advice and guidance.



PELICAN POINTERS HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF GIVING SITES

Setting up a sponsorship page with Justgiving.com, Virginmoneygiving.com or Mydonate.bt.com is a great place to start your fundraising for Pelican Cancer. It is quick, easy and incredibly convenient!

There are lots of ways that you can **ensure that your page inspires and is as effective as possible**. Below are some helpful tips to help you on your way to success:



Photos and videos - adding an image will make your page look more interesting. If you are able to **add a funny, imaginative video** your supporters are more likely to send your page to their friends.

Add some information about Pelican as people are always happier to support you when they understand the impact of their gift for the charity. We are always happy to provide any literature or information that you might require.

You may be tempted to email the web address to all your contacts immediately, but it may be useful to first send it to people you think will **sponsor a generous amount** as people tend to match what has already been pledged.

Remember to keep **your page looking fresh** and let your supporters know how you are getting on using the **update tool**.



PELICAN POINTERS HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF FUNDRAISING SITES

- Facebook and Twitter—sharing your page is another great way of gaining support. Using the Facebook app_means that your friends can sponsor you without leaving Facebook and the Tweeting app lets you schedule automatic Tweets.
- Let them help you the **social media guide** on these sites has lots of really great tips on making the most of social media for your fundraising.
- iPhone app. Keep your supporters updated with your latest news; upload your photos from your phone and share your page with your iphone contacts.
- TextGiving if you share your unique text code your supporters can sponsor you by text message instantly by texting your code and the donation amount to 70070. Texts are free and there are no hidden costs!
 - It is always worth contacting your **local paper to publicise your event**, but make sure that you include the web address of your fundraising page.
 - Don't give up, be persistent and always remember to keep your supporters updated. People may not instantly support you, but they might if you send them a reminder. Those who have already supported you will always be keen to know how you are getting on.
 - After the event: around 20 percent of online donations are given after the has taken place so make sure that everyone knows that you have completed the event. Don't forget the photos!

Saying THANK YOU IS VERY IMPORTANT. Don't forget to thank everyone who sponsored and supported you and let them know how it went.

PELICAN POINTERS—GIFT AID

Gift Aid is an opportunity for Pelican to claim 25p in every £1 donated – so if someone donates £100 and can Gift Aid the donation, it is worth £125 to Pelican, and it doesn't cost you a penny more! There are however conditions which must be met:

The donation must be given by an individual, company donations do not qualify



It must be made from personal money



The donor must give their name, address and postcode



The donor must have paid enough Income or Capital Gains Tax in the year of the claim to cover all their Gift Aided Donations



The donor must tick the box and the form must be dated

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PELICAN POINTERS SPONSORSHIP AND PUBLICITY



Who you might approach?

You might consider approaching local businesses or organisations for anything from a raffle prize, to asking them to sponsor an element of your event. Don't forget to keep notes of the person and company name so you can contact them after the event to thank them and tell them how much money you managed to raise!



Promoting your event

Think about ways of letting people know what you are doing, and encourage them to sponsor you or to come along.

Think about WHO you want to tell, What you want to tell, and HOW.

Here are a few tips to help you on your way:

- BE SHORT, COMPELLING AND TO THE POINT
- SAY WHAT YOU ARE DOING, HOW MUCH YOU WANT TO RAISE AND HOW THEY CAN HELP
- DON'T FORGET TO TELL THEM WHY YOU ARE SUPPORING PELICAN
- THINK ABOUT YOUR CONVERSATIONS BEFORE YOU HAVE THEM AS A DIFFERENT APPROACH MAY BE NEEDED EACH TIME
- FOLLOW UP YOUR CALL WITH AN EMAIL IF RELEVANT
- IF YOU HAVE ANY CONCERNS DON'T FORGET THAT WE ARE ALWAYS HERE TO HELP!



PELICAN POINTERS SPONSORSHIP AND PUBLICITY

LOCAL MEDIA AND HOW TO APPROACH!

A great way of generating extra sponsorship from friends and readers, as well as helping to raise awareness of the Pelican Cancer Foundation. Decide what media might be interested in your story—local newspaper, radio station or TV channel.

- Don't forget, no-one knows your local newspaper better than your local newsagent! So, pick up copies from the newstand or the local 'free sheet'. Look inside for the relevant editorial contact details.
- Alternatively, simply 'google' your local paper the name, number and email address of the news editor or reporter should be easy to find.

DON'T BE AFRAID TO SPEAK TO JOURNALISTS?

Like many professionals, journalists are very busy and they may seem impatient when you're talking to them. However, they take scores of calls every day from people. So don't be deterred, they are always on the look-out for heart-warming local stories like yours!

- Why not use the 'template' press release in this section as a guide just tailor the information to suit your event and email to the journalist.
- Local newspapers love to include photos with their stories, so emailing an accompanying photograph of your fundraising activity could help to ensure they cover the story. You must remember to include all the names of the people in the photograph!
- Don't forget to follow up with a phone call a few days later and find out where your story will appear.
- Be careful not to divulge any information that you would not be happy to see in print.

NOTES TO EDITORS. Established in 1993, the origins of the Pelican Cancer Foundation date back to the promotion of the ground-breaking work of Professor Bill Heald and his colleagues at Basingstoke Hospital in the development of bowel cancer surgery. The pioneering Total Mesorectal Excision (TME) procedure is now the benchmark treatment for rectal cancer across the world, halving the chance of cancer returning and minimising side-effects. 3,000 people are alive every year in the UK alone due to the techniques of TME surgery.

The charity continues to help patients with 'pelvic' area (eg. bowel, colorectal, bladder, prostate) and secondary liver cancer through supporting clinical research and further advancing precision surgery and treatment. The charity's belief that surgery cures more people than any other cancer intervention underpins its ethos and work. Pelican Cancer Foundation delivers courses and workshops for cancer specialists including surgeons, radiologists, pathologists, oncologists and nurses and shares life-saving and life-enhancing knowledge and skills with cancer teams across the UK and worldwide. To date, more than 9,000 cancer specialists have attended Pelican courses and workshops and since the year 2,000, Pelican has invested over £2 million in vital clinical research.

After receiving the news that her father had been diagnosed with rectal cancer, Penny and friends

PELICAN POINTERS SAFETY AND LEGALITY



It is important to make sure you, your event and your guests are safe and legal.

The safety and legality of your event should be a serious consideration, as you have sole responsibility for your fundraising. Pelican Cancer Foundation cannot accept any loss, damage or injury suffered by you or anyone else as a result of taking part in a fundraising event. Please make sure that you have adequate insurance if required.



Food hygiene is really important if you are providing food as part of your fundraising, or even selling it. Please take care when handling food, and work to basic rules for safe preparation, storage, display and cooking. If food is a major part of your event you may require a temporary food service permit. Your local health department will be happy to advise you. Bake sales do not need a permit.



If you are planning an active event, make sure you are fit!! If in any doubt ask your doctor's advice.



Copyright, don't forget to check this for any music, film and pictures that you wish to play/ show. For music, try PRS for Music (formerly the Performing Rights Society), which is a UK copyright collection society and performance rights organisation undertaking collective rights management for music www.prsformusic.com. For visual material, DACS (Design and Artists Copyright Society) website is helpful http://www.dacs.org.uk, and for film and tv programmes, you can use Film Bank http://www.filmbank.co.uk which licenses film usage outside the cinema and home.



You cannot sell alcohol unless your venue is licensed, unless you apply for a temporary licence from your local authority.



If you are using a venue, **check if you require Public Liability Insurance.** You may also need to request this if you are inviting businesses to attend your event, such as a Craft Fair.



DON'T FORGET: If the event is on private property, please remember to get permission from the owner/manager. Do not collect money door-to-door, this is illegal without the correct licence.
